

TJU Student Occupational Therapy Association and Fox Rehab Team up for Paralysis Research

More than 1,000 occupational therapy students and their friends and family came out for a tailgate hosted by Fox Rehabilitation at the Philadelphia OT Night at the Phillies game on Friday, June 18th. Our focus at Fox Rehab is seniors, and we’ve seen firsthand how occupational therapy can help seniors stay strong and active.”
